

What is perceptual nonduality?

- Not-separate "oneness without a second" Literally, not-two.
- Perceptual non-separation between subject and object https://youtu.be/UMQPr6_e56s?si=m0SQSyfoVG3gBhbR
- Direct, non-reflecting, non-conceptual experience of sensation and feeling, etc.
- Practices include mindfulness, meditation, contemplative disciplines.
- · Enlightenment, awakening,

Nondual mystical experience

- Non-reflecting awareness predominates
- diminishment of reflective, dualistic thinking and judgment
- No separation between subject and object (including the divine)
- separate, defined self considered an illusion, egoic
- Intuitive intelligence predominates
- rational, conceptual intelligence considered divisive
- Always present as awareness prior to thought
- Often considered a highest state of human consciousness

Metaphysical implications of nondual perception?

- Various forms of monism
 See-er and seen are one substance, variously conceived. E.g., Pantheism.
 Absolute nonduality.
- Panentheism Entities are in God and God in entities, but God also transcends universe.
 Relative non duality

Eastern / New Age Critique of Christianity


- God and creatures are "separate." This is an illusion.
 Christian teaching on sin exacerbates this issue.
- Western versions over-emphasize rational explanations, contributing to subject object dualisms, patriarchy, and authoritarianism.
- Christian teaching and spirituality does not lead to enlightenment, but to relational union, which is still "dualistic."
- Misunderstood Jesus' message that humans, like him, were in possession of divine nature. "The Father and I are One." (E.g., Adyashanti, Jesus as Avatar)

Nondual experience and Christianity

- · How might we understand these experiences in the light of Christian teachings?
- How are they similar to and different from the kind of experiences described by Christian mystics?
- · Can they lead us away from Christ and his Spirit, or can they help us open more fully to Him?
- Do they help us individuate? Grow in relationships? Practice works of mercy?
- Should Christians practice disciplines like Zen and certain forms of meditation associated with nondual experience?

Is Christianity a Nondual Religion?

- · God creates, conserves and communicates with creation.
- God and creation as not-separate, but are distinct
- · Creatures are real beings, each a distinct center of freedom and intelligence.
- · Jesus and the Father are one in several ways
- in mission and purpose
- in the Spirit
- incarnate Logos as Person one with the Father in the Trinity
- · The risen one is the individual, Jesus of Nazareth
- Ontological and relational connectedness affirmed
 I + Thou = WF
- Nondual mysticism can be affirmed in the above context



Dr. Jill Bolte Taylor

Neuroanatomist (brain scientist)

- · Stroke extinguished most left brain function
- Unable to distinguish sounds, shapes, meanings of people and things around her
- Secure and blissful when resting in right brain function
- · Could feel energy and friendliness of people around her
- Eventually recovered left brain function

Human consciousness

- Both dual and nondual in it operations; integration of left and right brain.
- Egoic consciousness reflecting, intentional, discriminating, practical.
 Helps us navigate our lives among other creatures and circumstances.
 Develop and integrate a sense of identity, actualize our gifts.
 More left brain
- Nonreflecting consciousness open, accepting, intuitive backdrop to Egoic.
 Can learn to experience through meditative practices.
 Direct, non-conceptual experience of reality, a kind of mystical experience.
 More right brain
- Unconscious mind deep sleep, dreaming

Nondual spirituality

- · Disciplines that reduce left brain activity
- · Shifting attention to right brain activity

- Does ultimate reality not express in ways the left brain connects with?
- Is left brain activity not spiritual in its own manner?
 Truth, wisdom, understanding, knowledge, etc.
- · Should Christians be more open to nondual practices?
